Ohio Board of Nursing requires a report that validates the applicant has not been convicted of, has not plead guilty to, and has not had a judicial finding of guilt for violating the following sections of the Ohio Revised Code or similar law of another state, the United States, or another country.

- Aggravated Murder; Murder; Voluntary Manslaughter; Felonious Assault; Kidnapping; Rape;
- Aggravated Robbery; Aggravated Burglary; Sexual Battery; Gross Sexual Imposition; and Aggravated Arson.

House Bill 327 – Felony Preclusion Bill

This bill, sponsored by Representative Latta, was signed by the Governor on April 9, 2002. It is an initiative to identify applicants for licensure with felony convictions. The Ohio Board of Nursing has the authority in this law to refuse to grant licensure to applicants with any of the felony convictions specified in the law.

The law requires a criminal records check for new applicants for licensure.

Candidates who wish to sit for the NCLEX RN or PN examination will be required to submit their fingerprints to the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation (BCI&I) and the FBI for identification and criminal background verification.
