Articulation Criteria and Articulation Benefits

The standard articulation, criteria ("Articulation Criteria") are:

- a. An official application,
- b. Completion of a Criminal Justice Associate of Applied Science Degree,
- c. Submission of official College transcripts of all previous college work from each institution attended,
- d. Grades of C- or better are accepted,
- e. A transfer applicant's cumulative college GPA must be 2.0 or higher to be accepted.
- f. Transfer credit is only awarded for course work completed at accredited institutions in which a grade of grade of C- or higher is earned.
- g. For those students who have earned an Associate in Science degree or an Associate of Arts degree from a regionally accredited institution, the University will waive the majority of the Core curriculum; students can expect to take approximately 6- 9 credits in the Core.
- h. Wheeling University accepts credits only. The computation of a student's grade point average will begin with courses taken at WU. A maximum of 90 credits will be accepted.
- i. All transcripts, credentials, and documents released to Wheeling University become the property of Wheeling University and cannot be returned or forwarded to a third party.
- j. The number of credits granted for a given course cannot exceed the number on the transcript from the school where they are earned, nor can it exceed the number earned in the corresponding course at Wheeling University.
- k. Full-time students are classified as follows:
 - Freshman - less than 27 semester hours
 - Sophomore - minimum of 27 semester hours
 - Junior - minimum of 60 semester hours
 - Senior - minimum of 90 semester hours
- l. A minimum of 30 institutional credits must be completed and are required for degree completion from Wheeling University. These credits must be earned at Wheeling University; 18 of which must be in the major.
- m. Fulfillment of residence requirements for the baccalaureate at Wheeling University, and fulfillment of residence requirements in the College of Criminal Justice. Credit earned by means of transfer courses does not count toward residence.
- n. Courses for which the student, is eligible to receive transfer credit, will be based upon the articulation agreement in place the term the student is admitted to Wheeling University.

The articulation benefits ("Articulation Benefits") are:

- a. Facilitate transfer of courses between Belmont, Criminal Justice Associate of Applied Science degree, and Wheeling University, Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice, see Appendices 1 & 2.

- b. Benefitting East Central Ohio and Northern West Virginia by infusing the job market with qualified graduates.
- c. All students accepted to Wheeling University are granted an academic scholarship, unless they are participating in the new commuter rate.
- d. A student who completes all of the associate degree requirements in the Associate of Applied Science degree at Belmont College (see Appendix 2) will be admitted into Wheeling University Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice program with junior status.
